Meetings & Events

The lower ground floor of the Strand Palace Hotel provides a dedicated space for meetings and conferences. Featuring nine rooms of varying sizes, the hotel is able to host any type of event. All fully equipped with the latest audio-visual technology, the largest suite is able to accommodate 250 delegates in a theatre-style setup or 84 when arranged cabaret-style, while the smallest seats eight to 15 depending on layout.

A separate reception area provides a fantastic support and networking space for day delegates.

History

The Strand Palace Hotel has a fascinating history that dates back more than 100 years when J. Lyons & co were given permission to build a grand hotel in the prominent Westminster thoroughfare of the Strand. Opened in 1909, the Strand Palace Hotel has remained under the same name ever since.

Its art deco foyer of the 1920s was deemed so impressive it is now housed by the Victoria & Albert museum.

In the war years, the hotel was proud to play its part by accommodating American servicemen, accepting ration vouchers in its restaurants and sheltering guests in the basement during air raids – while providing a much-needed escape to the war weary with regular dance evenings.

Today, the Strand Palace Hotel remains at the heart of the bustling West End and welcomes guests from all corners of the globe.
